Education Pre-Professional Program

This Program is a requirement before entering the teaching credential program at UCSB and most universities. A typical preprofessional will volunteer in a classroom for 4 to 6 hours each week. (UCSB requires a minimum of 60 preprofessional hours, and recommends 80 to 100 hours.) Pre-professionals are encouraged to take Education 121 and/or 122, the Pre-Professional Education Seminar and Fieldwork. In the ED 121 weekly seminars students discuss issues in education and learn new observational skills for the classroom. ED 122 requires 30 hours of volunteer work and a portfolio of classroom work aligned to the California Teaching Standards. Students receive 3 units of university credit for 121 and 2 units for ED122.
